Our Christmas Charity

New Life Home Trust is a charity that rescues abandoned babies in Kenya, cares for them and provides a new life – back with their birth family; with adoptive parents or in a New Life home for those who need lifelong care, typically children with additional needs or disabilities. Over 1,700 babies' lives have been changed by the charity since it was established in 1994. David and Anna are both trustees of New Life Home Trust UK CIO <https://newlifehometruster.org.uk> a partner charity which raises funds and awareness in the UK to support the important work in Kenya. David is a regular visitor to Kenya. In 2019, he will be taking a team of Paint Pots staff to visit one of the homes for babies and children with special needs. As part of our fundraising activities, we have produced a Christmas card for the coming season. Cards are available in packs of 10 at a cost of £3.50 All proceeds go directly to support the work in Kenya – less 15% to cover admin costs in the UK. We invite all parents to consider buying some cards if you would like to. It is a good opportunity to talk to your child about other children who are less fortunate than we are.

Autumn Activities!

Leaf maze

With all of the leaves cluttering up our gardens at the time of year, you can put them to good use by creating a leaf maze. Children will develop problem-solving and critical-thinking skills as they encounter road-blocks and dead-ends. Staying between the lines helps them develop special sense, and they learn to look and think ahead, and plan their steps as they navigate the maze from start to finish.

If you don't have time to create a maze, letting your children jump and crunch the leaves is just as much fun!



Nature Hunt

This activity is a great one for teaching young children to follow instructions and to encourage their listening skills, as well as having fun with parents and siblings. Create cards with simple instructions e.g. "walk to the garden and find a blue bucket, what is under the blue bucket?"

- Under the blue bucket will be an item and the next clue.
- The children can then use the bucket and collect all of the clues from around the garden, collecting all different types of objects from flowers, coloured leaves, stones, hidden treasures you place around the garden.
- Let the children know how many objects they need to find so they can count them as they go along.

This is a great game that can be played in your garden, inside your house, in the forest or even on a shopping trip!
